### WE DID IT!!!!

**Phase 1 of the Rhodo Ravine Restoration Project is complete!** We have a Concept Plan, bought and paid for, through the generosity of our 'Friends' members, a grant of \$2,000 from the Real Estate Foundation of BC and a sizable contribution from the District of North Saanich along with our own monies earmarked for this essential project.

We have begun Phase 2 which will include detail design, specifications and tender document preparation for the reconstruction of the ravine and updated cost estimates.

Some of the tasks for Phase 2 will include:

- a. Completing a more detailed topographic survey to improve the base plan for detailed design;
- **b.** Retaining a qualified biologist or ecologist to complete a screening level habitat assessment for CEAA Screening approval and Section 9 Water Act Approval;
- **c**. Retaining a geotechnical engineer to complete an assessment to review stability of ravine slopes, investigate options for improving drainage on ravine side slopes and assess foundation conditions for proposed stone bridge and stone retaining walls;
- **d**. Retain a qualified arborist to evaluate health of trees, identify risk trees and evaluate tree removal with respect to an overall landscape plan; and,

e. Preparing detailed design drawings, including details for proposed bridge, landscape elements, rock retaining walls, stream features, drainage improvements, etc.

We hope the community will support our efforts through contributions of money or specialist pro bono work. Our Grants Committee, Debbie Sherwood and Penny Boone, will be exploring all avenues possible for acquiring funds from granting agencies.

The **North Saanich Parks Commission** held a Park Plan Open House on June 19 to showcase future Parks Commission plans and to allow North Saanich residents to voice their opinions on the strategic 5 and 25 year plans.

The Friends were invited to take part in the event to show off our Concept Plan and to bring more public awareness of the Park and its volunteer work.

### DINGEE AND CONARD COMPANY (NURSERY), WEST GROVE, PENNSYLVANIA

On March 4th, 1913, William Macoun, Dominion Horticulturist, placed an order to Dingee and Conard for 2 each of 108 climbing roses to be sent via San Francisco and Vancouver to the Dominion Experimental Farm on Vancouver Island at the cost of \$54.00.

Dingee and Conard began nursery operations in 1868 (other sources suggest 1862) specializing in fruit trees, roses and other nursery products in West Grove, Pa. The firm started propagating roses under a new system introduced by Antoine Wintzer, the head nurseryman and world-class hybridizer. Conard conceived the idea of disposing of their rose stock through the mail. Their first catalogue offered bedding plants, shrubbery, bulbs, seeds and roses.

They began a mail order business in 1874 with an emphasis on roses which became the largest such operation in the USA. In 1892, Dingee and Conard separated and a new company was formed as Conard & Jones. Later it become Conard and Pyle, a horticultural house which has been based in West Grove, Pa for over 150 years and the introducer of the Peace rose to America (the peace Rose was developed in Europe) always specializing in rose production but at one time, they were the leading Canna growers and hybridizer in the USA. On June, 2010 the firm announced it is phasing out and within the year the Company plans only on royalties, licensing and plant breeding.

On December 23rd, 1922 the Dominion Experimental Station, as it was then called, published a list in the local newspaper of 71 roses and their capacity to be propagated under name, class, number of cuttings, when,

and number and percentage struck. This was for the benefit of the local rose growers.

Unfortunately, there are only a handful of roses remaining in the Park near the Centre's Office. However, only a few days ago, quite by chance, volunteers noticed white flowers very high up in tree branches. From a distance it appeared to be a Snowball bush but on a closer look, it was a white rambling rose located in the original planting area and certainly by looking at the canes, a very old plant. So the search begins. By cross referencing the old invoices and planting plans, and with the help of a rose expert, we may be able to identify this specimen shown at right.

## Featured Plant

### Acer saccharum (sugar maple)

An ornamental, deciduous large tree. It resembles the Norway maple and is one of the finest trees for fall colour with different specimens displaying orange, gold or scarlet tints. Native to Central and Eastern North America. Introduced in 1735. It is the Acer which produces maple sugar and maple syrup.

Our specimen came from the sister Dominion Research Station in Kentville, Nova Scotia in 1967 and was designated a Heritage tree in April 1976. It is located west of the Picnic Shelter, tag #13983.

Be sure to visit the Park in the fall to witness the amazing colours not only in the Sugar Maple but other wonderful 'dressed' for fall trees and shrubs.
